NATIONAL GIRLS COLLABORATIVE PROJECT



Project Goals

1. **Maximize access to shared resources** within projects and with public and private sector organizations and institutions interested in **expanding girls' participation in STEM.**
2. **Strengthen capacity** of existing and evolving projects by sharing **exemplary practice research** and program models, outcomes and products.
3. **Use the leverage of a network or collaboration** of individual girl-serving STEM programs to create the **tipping point for gender equity in STEM.**



Project Focus 2011-2016

1. Strengthen the capacity of girl-serving STEM programs to effectively **reach and serve underrepresented girls** in STEM.
2. Increase the effectiveness of Collaboratives by providing professional development focused on **sustainability, organizational effectiveness, and shared leadership**.
3. Maximize **K-12 school counselors'** access to and use of relevant, high-quality resources that increase awareness of barriers to girls' interest and engagement in STEM.

- **13,456,465** visits to the NGCP Web site in 5 years

- **5,313,811** girls are served indirectly by NGCP by having their leaders trained in the philosophy, knowledge, and methods of NGCP

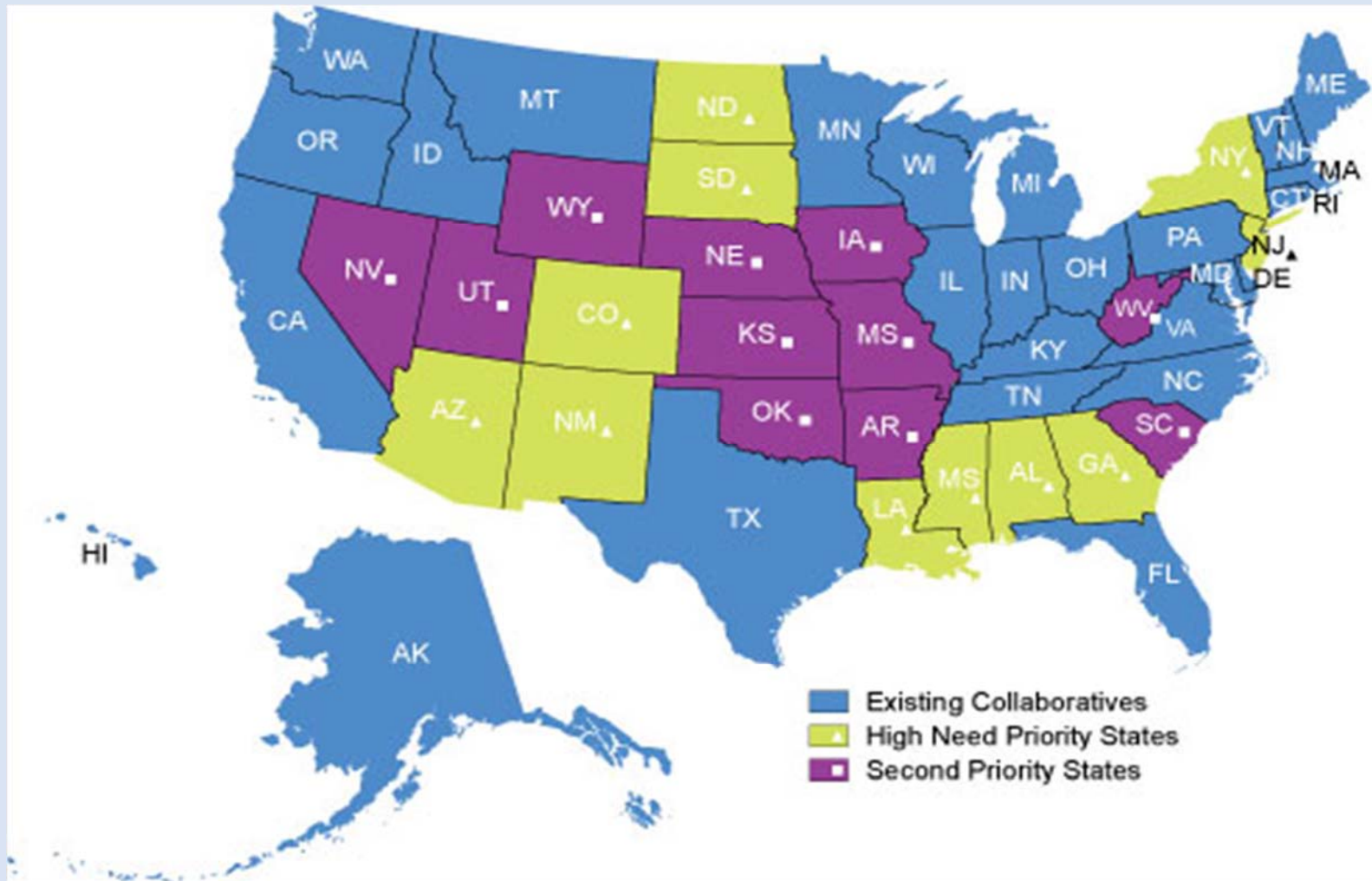

EVALUATION

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NGCP Metrics

As of October 2011

- 2261 programs are listed in the online NGCP Program Directory
- 243 mini-grants awarded and over 17,058 participants served in 126 mini-grants completing activities
- 9,308 practitioners have been served through events and Webcasts
- 5,035,918 girls are served indirectly by NGCP
- 12,721,111 visits to the NGCP website in 4 years



NGCP Metrics

As of October 2011

- 50 average NGCP webcast participants (live broadcast)
- 76 total NGCP events offered by Collaboratives
- 3,223 total NGCP event attendees
- 61 attendees on average at 20 NGCP Kick-off events
- 38 attendees on average at 33 NGCP Forums
- 17,058 participants served in 126 mini-grants completing activities



NGCP Evaluation Findings

- Are girl-serving STEM programs strengthened by NGCP to effectively reach and serve underrepresented girls in STEM?*
- Do K-12 school counselors access and use resources related to girls' interest and engagement in STEM through NGCP?
